

KEEPING HOLY WEEK TOGETHER

Holy Week this year coincides with our returning to worship in our church buildings, and we hope you'll be able to join us, either in person or on line, as we prepare together for Easter.

Even so, this Easter will feel different. Our services are likely to be simpler. Face coverings, hand sanitiser, careful distancing and well ventilated buildings all remain part of our life and worship. Though there will be music, there can't be singing together, and even in the warmth of Spring, you may want to think about bringing a rug or an extra sweater to a ventilated church.

And our usual provision continues on line, with some services streamed on our Halas Team facebook page - especially Maundy Thursday 7:30pm Eucharist from Cradley, Good Friday Evening from St John's and Easter Morning from Lapal.



Palm Sunday marks our return to Gathered Services in Church again. Public Health Dudley have suggested that this is the Sunday on which our communities should feel ready to return to public worship safely, and that fits in well with the advice from Worcestershire and Bromsgrove.

Our services will probably feel simpler than in past years - processions won't be possible in the same way for instance - and our present online provision will continue as normal on **Halas Team Facebook** and **halasteam.org** alongside our services in church.

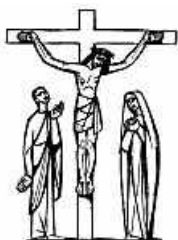

Walking the way of the Cross
